

2020 US Census Data for Greater Shepherd Park

The US Census Bureau has released census data for Washington at the census tract level. We are fortunate that census tract 16 includes most of our entire membership area: Shepherd Park, North Portal Estates, and Colonial Village, but not Walter Reed.

Here are a few highlights:

- Total population is 4,471, up 13% from 2010;
- Black population decreased 6.9% to 2,487;
- White population increased 33.5% to 1,331;
- Latino poulation increased 67% to 334;
- Asian population increased 30.9% to 72;
- Per capita income is \$66,244 (2019);
- Median household income is \$175,662 (2019);
- Median value of housing \$859,000 (2019);
- 55% have higher than a bachelor's degree.

DCPS - Reopening Strong

On August 30 District of Columbia Public Schools (DCPS) opened for full in-person learning for the school year. DCPS students have been taking classes virtually since March of 2020.


The opening of the 2021-2022 school year coincides with a rise in COVID-19 cases in our city due in large part to the highly transmissible delta variant. To reduce risk to exposure to COVID-19, DCPS kicked off the back-to-school

season with the #ReopenStrong campaign and has taken the following steps:

- Parents educated to keep kids home if exhibiting symptoms,
- Masks mandated for all students and staff,
- Enhanced school HVAC systems,
- Deep cleaning protocols established,
- Classrooms and other school spaces reorganized to maintain appropriate distance between students and adults,
- Adjustments to meal routines,
- Symptom screening and reporting,
- Notification of cases at schools.

DCPS, in conjunction with the DC Department of Health, has been offering free vaccinations to students between the ages of 12 and 18 at various middle and high schools. If exposed to COVID-19, students and teachers who are vaccinated will only need to quarantine at home if exhibiting symptoms. If exposed to COVID-19, unvaccinated students and staff will need to quarantine at home for 7 days and provide a negative test result.

DCYOP Starts 3rd Year at Takoma Elementary

19. Founded in 1960, the
program provides group

lessons and ensemble training to students ages 4.5-18 from DC, Maryland, and Virginia. Students may start a new instrument or can audition for one of DCYOP's various ensembles and orchestras. Rehearsals and lessons take place on Saturdays at Takoma Elementary during the school year. Tuition is affordable, thanks to grants and private gifts that offset program costs. Tuition assistance also is available on a sliding scale.

Although the year has already started, DCYOP accepts students at any time if they already play. "Our aim is to create the next generation of citizen musicians," says Executive Director Elizabeth Schurgin. "We accept all kids who want to play in the orchestra."

Nell LaBeach Turns 100!





A group of local citizens, including Liz Crafford and Matt Chambers from Shepherd Park and Catherine Stratton Treadway and Tanya Topolewski from Takoma DC, have been working with The Parks at Walter Reed to encourage planting native plants and avoiding the use of non-native plants, especially invasive plants.

The Parks is currently designing and installing beautiful landscape plantings throughout the 40+ acre site. It is a unique opportunity to make a large-scale impact bringing birds, butterflies, and bees to the site situated next to Rock Creek Park.

Global bird and insect populations have declined precipitously, due to habitat destruction, particularly the loss of native plants on which birds and insects depend. Non-native plants do not provide the food, nectar, pollen, and nesting materials that caterpillars and bees need.

The group contacted the developers of The Parks earlier this summer. The developers have expressed a willingness to use more native plants and avoid invasive plants.



The Walter Reed site was humming with activity this summer. Several projects are well underway. For more information see theparksdc.com.

Fern Street Townhouses

The Walter Reed Development team proposes to construct 144 townhomes and "two over two" condominiums along Fern and Elder Streets. The team presented its proposal to the Walter Reed LRA at its community meeting on July 12 and to other neighborhood groups throughout the summer.

Primrose School Opens Its Doors

Primrose Schools at the Parks DC is currently scheduled for a mid-October 2021 opening in the ground floor of The Vale at Aspen Street and Georgia Ave. Primrose Schools® is a national system of accredited private preschools that provides early education and child care experience for children from six weeks old to age five.

Senior Affordable Assisted Living

Construction started in April 2021 for 54 assisted living units in Building 14 "North". They are slated to be delivered next year.

Building IJ ("The Hartley")

Demolition of the former main hospital building is complete. Construction of the structure to house 323 apartments and 60,000 square feet of retail including a Whole Foods grocery is well underway. The opening is currently scheduled for mid-2022.

Town Center

The Town Center, between The Hartley and Georgia Avenue and composed of retail spaces, is well underway. Utilities, roads, and plaza work are emphasized. Completion of the work will align with the



opening of The Hartley in mid-2022. Construction on Buildings O and P begins later this fall.

Construction is scheduled to begin on 50 townhomes next year.

Georgia Ave Parcel QRS

The design and bidding process for this apartment building to be constructed along Georgia Ave is ongoing. Construction for this approved project is scheduled to begin next year.

Garden Apartments Get New Lease on Life

Plans are underway to remake 7428 Georgia Avenue NW, the gardenstyle apartment building next to the Shepherd Park Library. Lock7, owners of the property since 2014, will be expanding the building up and out to create 66 units, offering

a mix of studio, 1, 2, and 3 bedroom residences. Amenities will include a lobby, fitness room, club room, bike storage, and some parking. There is no retail component. All units

will be for lease only and not available for sale. Built in partnership with DCHD, the units will be 100% affordable. The building renovation is fully "by right," and Lock7 is not requesting zoning relief for any items.

Contruction is slated to begin in November, with an estimated 18-month construction period. The owners are working to relocate the eight existing tenants until the project is completed, and those tenants will have first rights to return to the building upon completion.


