

HOST YOUR #STOPADANI EVENT AT YOUR MP'S OFFICE

Thanks for helping make the #StopAdani National Week of Action a great success.

Organising your local event is a crucial part of making sure every politician knows their community does not want a \$1B loan going to prop up Adani's coal project. Here are some handy tips to plan the event, and for the big day.

GETTING READY

Time to get creative! Paint a banner or a placard, make props (e.g a giant game-show style cardboard cheque, brown paper money bags with dollar signs etc).

Send a reminder text to friends, colleagues or family you want to come along

Invite and remind any other Facebook friends you haven't already, pointing to the Facebook event page you've set up

Write a simple letter to your MP to hand over on the day.

You don't have to be an expert, just write a simple letter outlining your concerns. You can find out more detail here about the project if you want to quote facts and figures

Make it clear you expect a response to your request that they rule out supporting any \$1B loan for Adani (include your address so they can write back to you!)

Find your MP's office phone number on the next page!

ON THE DAY

Charge your phone before you go, and remember to bring your letter to your MP.

Pack your props, aiming to get to the office 15 minutes before the start time of your event.

As people arrive for the event, welcome them and introduce yourself as the host.

Have fun, take photos, and don't forget to deliver your letter!

Ask everyone who has come along to:

- Gather for a group shot with the MP's office sign in plain view (post this pic to your Facebook event page)
- Call the MP's phone number with their message
- Post a selfie on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram with the #StopAdani hashtag.
- Optional extra: ask each person to call the Prime Minister's office to leave a message for the PM about why they oppose the loan. The PM's number: (02) 6277 7700
