

Breakout Summary:

For cities to meet our carbon reduction goals, we cannot rely on carbon emission reduction strategies alone. Carbon sequestration, especially through the capture and recycling of organic material, is a key way cities like Cleveland will meet their climate action goals.

Brett KenCairn, Director, Urban Drawdown Initiative, provided an introduction to UDI and shared innovative ways cities are treating carbon as a resource, not a burden. Marc White/Randy McShepard of Rid-All Green Partnership and Daniel Brown of Rust Belt Riders highlighted local efforts and opportunities to scale up organic waste diversion and reuse in Cleveland.
