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Dr. Judith Vergun is a Plant Community Ecologist and Ecological Educator. She received her degrees in the College of Agricultural Sciences, Oregon State University (OSU) in 1993, when she accepted a faculty position in the College of Oceanic and Atmospheric Sciences, OSU. Beginning in 2002 she held a joint appointment with OSU and the School of Ocean and Earth Sciences and Technology, University of Hawai'i at Manoa. In 2004, Vergun was honored with a Presidential Award for Excellence in Science, Mathematics and Engineering Mentoring for the Native Americans in Marine and Space Sciences Program that included the Hawaiian Kumu Ola Source of Knowledge Program, the Diversity Internship Program for African American and Latino students, and the Traditional Ecological Knowledge Program for graduate students. Vergun's work links traditional and local knowledge of homeplace and scientific research to create a body of knowledge and wisdom about sustainable management practices and shared philosophies. She is an honored Ecologist in the Ecological Society of America, a Seguovah Fellow and Elder in the American Indian Science and Engineering Society, Inaugural Program Director for the Leopold Leadership Program -- training scientists in effective communication strategies, and she is currently Director for Conference and Presentation Programs in the Association for Integrity and Responsible Leadership in Economics and Related Professions, Washington DC.
