Simon Rees Director Govett-Brewster Art Gallery and Bry Kopu Chairperson Tu Tama Wahine o Taranaki invite you to attend a Walk of Peace.

In recognition of Waitangi Day and as an extension of the Govett-Brewster Art Gallery exhibition Our Hearts of Darkness 2015, we are co-hosting a symbolic event to present a community weaving project Te Korowai Rangimarie to Tu Tama Wahine o Taranaki.

Inspired by an artwork by Parihaka artist Ngahina Hohaia, a Walk of Peace will follow the footsteps of prisoners from Parihaka in 1881 along Queen St and past the court house.

The procession will carry Te Korowai Rangimarie created by four master weavers and Taranaki community members, that was made as part of the Govett-Brewster's White Ribbon Day support project.

Walk of Peace will cross the court house lawn, and continue to Tu Tama Wahine o Taranaki on Powderham Street for a whakatau welcome.
