Introduction

The publication of our Nanny State Rich List in 2018 showed that the size and excess of public health organisations throughout the UK is increasing. Not merely content with implementing a punitive sugar tax on the population in 2018¹, there have been calls by the former England chief medical officer, Prof. Dame Sally Davies, to consider expanding this to unhealthy food in general.² This all comes at a time when taxes are already at a 50 year high.³

This research outlines the total remuneration in excess of £100,000 received by senior staff working within public health in England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. It shows that public health groups remain influential within government, at an ever greater cost to the taxpayer.

Key findings

Overall findings

- The highest remunerated public health employee in the country was **Dr. Adrian Mairs**, the acting director of public health at **Public Health Agency (Northern Ireland)**. His total remuneration was £311,500 in 2018-19. This included a salary between £155,000 and £160,000 and an employer pension contribution of £154,000.
- 21 public health employees received a higher salary than the prime minister's current salary of £154,908 in 2019-20.
- Britain's 10 top paid public health employees earn an average of £242,650, with two
 individuals receiving over £250,000, including one individual receiving over £300,000.
- UK local authorities' directors of public health receiving over £150,000 have increased from
 17 in 2017-18 to 22 in 2018-19, an increase of over 29 per cent.
- The public health director for NHS Forth Valley, Graham Foster, has seen his total remuneration rise in 2018-19 by a huge £98,000 over 62 per cent to £255,500 from the previous year, for the same position.

Public Health England (PHE)

- PHE has 242 employees in receipt of total remuneration in excess of £100,000, a slight increase on the 241 employees of the previous year.
- Six individuals working for PHE received total remunerations in excess of £200,000 in 2018-19. This is a 50 per cent increase from 2017-18, when four individuals received over £200,000.

Public Health Wales (PHW) and Welsh University health boards

- 12 employees within Public Health Wales and Welsh University Health Boards were in receipt of total remuneration in excess of £100,000. This includes **seven** individuals who receive in excess of £150,000.
- The average salary paid to senior PHW employees has risen to £176,429 in 2018-19 from £151,786 in 2017-18, an increase of over 16 per cent.

Public Health Agency (Northern Ireland)

The Public Health Agency's acting director of public health, Dr. Adrian Mairs, received total remuneration of £311,500, the highest in the country by almost £60,000. This is in addition to two other members of staff receiving total remuneration in excess of £100,000.

Scottish NHS trusts

- The public health director for NHS Forth Valley, Graham Foster, has seen his total remuneration in **2018-19** rise by a huge **£98,000** to **£255,500** from the previous year. This is an increase of over **62 per cent**.
- The remuneration of NHS Orkney public health director, Dr. Louise Wilson, rose by over **15 per cent** from the previous year, increasing to **£141,500** in **2018-19**.

Local authorities

- The highest earning local authority employee in 2018-19 was Mike Gogarty, director of wellbeing, public health and communities for Essex county council, who received total remuneration of £194,020.
- The number of local authorities' public health directors earning over £150,000 have increased from 17 in 2017-18 to 22 in 2018-19, an increase of 29 per cent.
- The **top five** local authority public health directors by remuneration are:
 - **Mike Gogarty**, who worked for **Essex county council** as director of wellbeing, public health and communities, received £194,020.
 - Nada Lemic-Stojevic, as director of public health for the London borough of Bromley, received total remuneration of £193,295.
 - **Virginia Pearson**, chief officer for communities, public health, environment and prosperity for **Devon county council** received a total of £189,459.
 - Dr John Linnane, assistant director people (head of public health) for Warwickshire county council received total remuneration of £188,140.
 - Carlton Brand, executive director of adult care, public health and digital, received £185,148 in total.

Sources and methodology

This report has been compiled principally from the 2018-19 annual reports published by Public Health England, Public Health Wales, the Public Health Agency North Ireland, Scottish NHS trusts, Welsh university health boards and finally of local authorities. The sole use of a freedom of information request was to establish the number of Public Health England employees in receipt of more than £100,000 in total remuneration.

Where pay has been reported within bands of £5,000, a mid-point has been shown. Total remuneration includes, but is not limited to, salary, benefits in kind, expenses, bonuses, redundancy payments and employer's pension contributions (unless stated otherwise in the notes to the accounts). Remuneration figures and employee names where given are correct up to the end of the 2018-19 fiscal year.
