

UPS Proposes 70-Hour Weeks



UPS has a contract proposal on the table that would give the company the right to force package drivers to work up to 70 hours a week anytime management deems it necessary “to avoid service disruptions.”

The union's current contract proposal would give drivers the right to refuse to work after we work 60 hours in a week. The danger is that the Hoffa administration will cave in to the company and water down this language. That’s already happened on 9.5 and harassment.

Members need to make our voices heard. We have the right to vote on the contract. If the contract doesn’t put a stop to excessive overtime and harassment, then members need to be ready to put a stop to the contract by voting no and sending them back to the table.
