DECLARATION OF GENE HOFFMAN  
FOR CALGUNS FOUNDATION, INC.

1 I, GENE HOFFMAN, declare as follows:

2 1. I am the Chairman of THE CALGUNS FOUNDATION, INC.

3 2. THE CALGUNS FOUNDATION, INC., (CGF) is a non-profit organization  
4 incorporated under the laws of California with its principal place of business  
5 in San Carlos, California.

6 3. The purposes of CGF include supporting the California firearms community  
7 by promoting education for all stakeholders about California and federal  
8 firearms laws, rights and privileges, and defending and protecting the civil  
9 rights of California gun owners.

10 4. As part of CGF's mission to educate the public – and gun-owners in  
11 particular – about developments in California's firearm laws, CGF  
12 maintains a website at <http://calgunsfoundation.org> and contributes content  
13 to various print and online media.

14 5. On their website CGF informs its members and the public at large about  
15 pending civil and criminal cases, relating to developments in federal and  
16 California gun law. The website hosts forums and publishes notices that  
17 document the concerns that California gun owners threats to their Second  
18 Amendment rights.

19 6. CGF expends financial and other resources in both litigation and non-  
20 litigation projects to protect the interests of their patrons, members and the  
21 public-at-large. CGF brings this action on behalf of itself and its supporters,  
22 who possess all the indicia of membership.

23 7. CGF agreed to sponsor this lawsuit, in part, because the "500 foot rule" at  
24 issue in this matter is apparently designed and intended to ban gun stores in  
25 densely populated urban centers. Its effect is to discriminate against the  
26 very people who need access to the means of self-defense as defined by the  
27 Second Amendment. Many people in densely populated urban centers to not  
28 have access to transportation that could take them to outlying suburban and

1 industrial districts. This (almost) exact issue of limiting gun stores in  
2 metropolitan areas was recently addressed in a Seventh Circuit case in which  
3 the Calguns Foundation, Inc., provided litigation support and material  
4 assistance. That case is *Ezell v. City of Chicago*, 651 F.3d 684, 2011 U.S.  
5 App. LEXIS 14108. (7<sup>th</sup> Cir., July 6, 2011).

6 8. The facts of this case do not involve this proposed gun store's proximity to a  
7 school district, day care facility, other firearms sales business or a liquor  
8 store. The sole disqualifying fact given by the County's Board of Supervisors  
9 for revoking the CUP and Variance was the "500 foot rule" as it applied to a –  
10 residentially zoned district. (Oakland Municipal Code § 17.54.131)

11 9. There is no rational basis for this rule.

12 10. The mere presence of firearms, albeit privately owned rather than as  
13 inventory, in a residential district is beyond the control of local governments  
14 under California's preemption doctrine and statutory law. See: *Doe v. City*  
15 *and County of San Francisco*, 136 Cal. App. 3d 509 and *Fiscal v. City and*  
16 *County of San Francisco*, 158 Cal. App. 4<sup>th</sup> 895. In other words, there is  
17 nothing in federal or state law the prohibits a law abiding gun owner, who  
18 might be a collector or shooting enthusiast, from owning and keeping scores  
19 of firearms in his residence. Therefore local governments like the County of  
20 Alameda cannot prevent a law-abiding gun owner from collecting and storing  
21 an unlimited number of firearms in his home. A residence, and by extension,  
22 a residentially zoned district, cannot be a designated as a sensitive place.  
23 See also: *District of Columbia v. Heller*, 554 U.S. 570 (2008) and *McDonald v.*  
24 *Chicago*, 561 U.S. \_\_\_, 130 S.Ct. 3020 (2010).

25 11. Furthermore, the transportation of firearms is particularly and strictly  
26 regulated by state law. For any person not licensed to carry concealed  
27 firearms, all firearms must be transported unloaded and handguns must be  
28 transported in a locked container. See CA Penal Code § 25300 *et seq.*

- 1 12. From my understanding of the STAFF REPORTS (Exhibits N & O attached  
2 to the Declaration of NOBRIGA, TEIXEIRA and GAMAZA) regarding the  
3 request for a Variance and CUP, the County’s own Planning Department  
4 found no significant impact on the residential properties, yet still  
5 recommended denial based on the tautology of the “500 foot rule.”
- 6 13. It further appears from the STAFF REPORT:
- 7 a. That the building security issues (physical and electronic) raised by  
8 the County Sheriff are easily addressed and NOBRIGA, TEIXEIRA  
9 and GAMAZA have promised to modify their building, if necessary, to  
10 address those issues.
  - 11 b. That any fire code issues raised by the Alameda County Fire  
12 Prevention Office are easily addressed and NOBRIGA, TEIXEIRA and  
13 GAMAZA have promised to comply with all fire-code requirements.
  - 14 c. Traffic and parking are non-issues.
  - 15 d. Handicap Access modifications to the building were promised or have  
16 already been completed.
  - 17 e. The hours of operation are limited to daylight hours.
  - 18 f. We know (from BRANDON COMBS’s declaration) that gun store  
19 employees and patrons are – by definition – law-abiding people.
- 20 14. There is simply no ration basis (let alone important government interest or  
21 compelling government interest) for imposing the enhanced “500 foot rule” on  
22 retail gun stores *vis-à-vis* their proximity to residential districts.
- 23 15. Gun stores that can meet the licensing requirements of the federal and state  
24 government, that also comply with the safety requirement of the County  
25 Sheriff, the fire code requirements of the County Fire Prevention Office, and  
26 the rather pedestrian requirements of other retail establishments for parking  
27 and accessibility, should be treated like any other land use applicant.
- 28 16. Furthermore, the fact that gun stores sell constitutionally protected artifacts

necessary for exercising a fundamental right, should required the government to present extraordinary facts to satisfy their extraordinary claims.
