** Based on an evaluation of carry licensing in other U.S. states and California Dept. of Justice data on firearm purchases. The Calguns Foundation believes that the 2% of population factor is a conservative estimate of the number of Californians currently residing in "no issue" or "low issue" counties who will seek a license to carry a handgun within 120 days from their first opportunity. In other jurisdictions, demand will likely increase over current values due to many factors including (but not limited to) news reports, inter-cultural communication, reinvigorated interest in the exercise of Second Amendment rights, and seeking a handgun carry license as a form of political speech.
