San Francisco is in a severe housing crisis. It's imperative that we continue to build housing to accommodate all income levels without negatively affecting the character of our community. We are seeing displacement occur at record levels. Specifically, increased income inequality and a continuing out-migration of working class families right here in District 10 is putting our values at risk. When we talk about affordable housing we must also address proximity to transit, open space, investment in social capital, and other quality of life issues. As Supervisor, I will prioritize building housing along Third St. and other transit corridors, maximizing opportunities within public housing (and other public land) to build more affordable housing, and ensuring that developers build affordable housing units on-site. As Commissioner for the Office of

Community Investment and Infrastructure—we held developers accountable to community benefits agreements and funded affordable housing at all income levels. Not only will I continue to do the same as Supervisor, but I will also advocate that transit options match the demands of development and adequate open space. I will also fight to that ensure proper neighborhood-serving amenities are made available. We have to have a regional housing strategy that is hyper-focused on creating more low and middle-income and family housing.
