

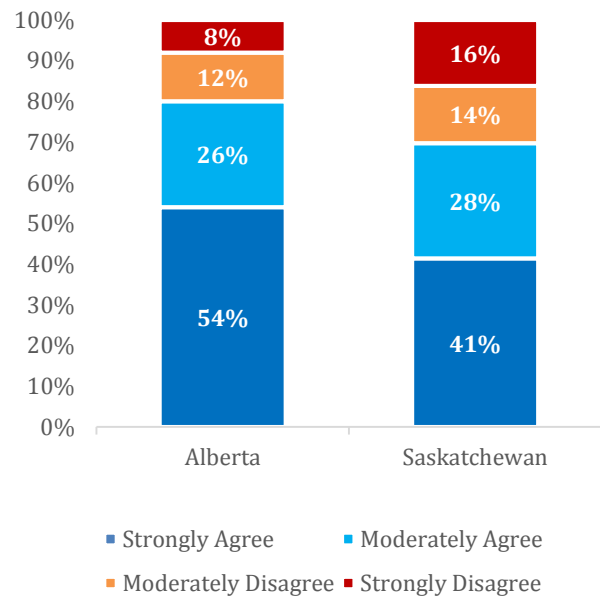
Survey of 300 Albertans and 300 Saskatchewanians conducted using a national online panel between February 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>, 2016. The margin of error is +/- 5.6%, nineteen times out of twenty in each province. Results were weighted by age, and gender.

## WHAT WAS ASKED

Q1. Do you agree or disagree with the following statement? : Because Quebec politicians say they do not want Western Canadian oil piped through their communities, Alberta and Saskatchewan should cut off equalization payments to Quebec.  
Which of the following statements is closest to your own point of view?

- Strongly agree
- Moderately agree
- Moderately disagree
- Strongly disagree

**A strong consensus exists with a clear majority of people in both provinces (80% in Alberta and (70% in Saskatchewan) believe that equalization payments should be cut off to Quebec because they do not want Western Canadian oil piped through their communities.**



Results by age and gender (both provinces combined)

	Male	Female	18 to 34	35 to 54	55 & older
Agree	77%	73%	77%	72%	76%
Disagree	23%	27%	23%	28%	24%

Men are slightly more like to agree to cutting off equalization and middle-aged people are slightly less likely, but these differences are barely statistically significant, and no matter the demographic a clear and significant majority supports the proposition.
