

# **2019 ANNUAL REPORT**



#### **LEGAL SERVICES**

Provided multilingual legal services and workshops to **48 immigrant entrepreneurs and cooperatives.** 

Launched Law for Economic Democracy, an online network of nearly 200 legal and tax professionals supporting economic democracy.



Launched our Virtual Legal

Cafe program to increase access to our legal services, and advised more than 200 clients at our Resilient Communities Legal Cafes.

# **RESEARCH & EDUCATION**

Convened **14 economic justice attorneys** from across the US and Puerto Rico for 8 days of intensive training, networking, and community building.

Hosted a 3-day gathering, the <u>Nonprofit Democracy</u> <u>Network: Tools for Collective Self-Governance</u> to help **30** social justice organizations become more effective, accountable, and equitable.



Reached more than 2,000 folks through our book clubs, *Think Outside the Boss Workshops*, and Legal Cafe Teach-Ins, trainings, and presentations.

Mentored **9 summer interns**, who worked on unique projects, and participated in our <u>Solidarity Economies Tour</u>, a 1-day adventure visiting Bay Area coops.

Sold out our 2nd Annual <u>Social Enterprise Seminar</u>, an all-day training for legal professionals who serve the needs of local sustainable economies.

Worked with Sogorea Te Land Trust, POCSHN, and others to organize the <u>Bay Area Land Justice Convening</u> to seed a 100-year vision for Bay Area land justice.

Supported the Initiative for Energy Justice's <u>Energy Justice</u> <u>Strategy and Policy Workshop</u> to develop an agenda to advance local & state policies for equitable clean energy.

Provided legal research to support Democracy Collaborative's advocacy for <u>democratic ownership of pharmaceutical development and distribution</u> in the US.

### **INCUBATION & FISCAL SPONSORSHIP**

We continue to give legal support to our incubated projects, the <u>East Bay Permanent Real Estate</u>

<u>Cooperative</u> and <u>People Power Solar Cooperative</u> and share resources for others to <u>replicate these models</u>. We have also sponsored and incubated new projects, such as:

1) The Next Egg, a resource and community for people who want to channel their retirement savings out of Wall Street and into life-sustaining enterprises in our communities.



- 2) <u>Cooperative Professionals Guild</u>, a home for lawyers and accountants who specialize in cooperative business models.
- 3) Minnow, a people of color-led project to shift California farmland off the speculative market and to farmers of color and to indigenous governance.

#### **ADVOCACY**

Hosted 6 **Compost Policy Parties** where to advocate for healthy soil and convened 29 organizations to sign onto a <u>cartoon letter</u> to state regulators to preserve a diverse, community-scale composting sector.

Mobilized the Bay Area's worker cooperative community to convince the <u>City of Santa Clara</u> and the <u>City of Berkeley to commit \$100,000 to worker cooperative development.</u>

Hosted Policy Cafes on topics such as <u>Intro to</u> <u>Local Ballot</u> <u>Initiatives</u> and <u>How to Run for</u> <u>Oakland City</u> <u>Council.</u>
