The Cleveland National Forest Foundation (CNFF) is hiring interns to promote the [50-10 Transit Plan](#). CNFF is a nonprofit group dedicated to preserving the plants, animals and other natural resources of Southern California mountains by protecting the land and water they need to survive. The CNFF transit campaign, Transit San Diego, is committed to transforming the cities of our region into flourishing biking, pedestrian and transit based communities.

Under the supervision of the Transportation Justice Project Director, the community organizer will educate the public to promote awareness of transit from a regional perspective so that communities will have an informed and effective voice on regional planning issues. The organizer will work with community organizations, neighborhood groups and local leaders to publicize strategies on how to best achieve transit based alternatives for mobility in the San Diego region in order to improve the region's health, economy and environment.

Duties:

- Mobilize community support for the 50-10 Transit Plan
- Outreach, engagement and organizing of residents
- Engage with the leaders of community groups, organizations and neighborhoods
- Use social media connections such as Facebook, Twitter, Meet-up, etc
- Write reports and evaluations regarding the project
