Our vision is to become the leading resettlement organization supporting victims of persecution, empowering them to create a future for themselves and their children as fully integrated Canadian citizens.

This is an incredibly challenging and rewarding time for Project Abraham, our Yezidi Educational Support (YES) teachers, and our Yezidi students. Despite all the difficulties, we have kept our ESL program going throughout the pandemic by working together as a community to stay safe.

During the summer, we used outdoor canopies with strict social distancing rules and continued to teach English lessons. Now, with stricter lockdown rules, thanks to grants and donations, we have been able to supply all our students and teachers with over fifty Chromebooks under our Laptop Acquisition Program (LAP). This has enabled us to continue our YES program online.

Many thanks to all our donors and volunteers, the staff of Project Abraham, and to the teachers and students who work so hard to make YES a great success during this difficult time!

# Our First Virtual Community Connection Event

Now that our YES participants have all received Chromebooks along with a Kurmanji training video to ease their learning curve, we were able to have our first community Zoom gathering on January 31st. Approximately 40 Yezidis were in attendance along with YES teachers and interpreters. We shared video tours of Canada, Ontario and Toronto and then reconvened in smaller break-out rooms to discuss experiences. Later, pizza was delivered to each home. Feedback has been very positive and we are now in the planning stages of our next Community Connection event. Partner organizations such as Family Services York Region (FSYR) are delighted that the community now has the ability to participate in Zoom meetings as they have also great programs they would like to offer.
