Exercise Your Right to Vote, September 30, 2016

If you have 30 or more days on the job, you are a union member and eligible to vote in Friday's Union Election. This is a reminder to Local 234 members employed by SEPTA, about what you should bring to the polling place.

To vote a regular ballot, you must bring your SEPTA pass and Voter Card to the polling place **at your location**. If you don't have a Voter Card, call the Election Committee immediately (215-972-4140) and you will be provided with a substitute voter card. You can pick up a substitute Voter Card on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday, at the latest, from 9:00 a.m. thru 7:00 p.m. at the Union Hall.

"Floaters" who can vote at multiple locations will follow the same procedure. Floaters must bring their SEPTA pass and Voter Card to cast a regular ballot.

When you cast your ballot, the poll watcher from the American Arbitration Association will collect your Voter Card. If you requested and received a substitute Voter Card, you must present the substitute card to vote a regular ballot.

No Local 234 member will be denied the right to vote

If you show your SEPTA pass, but don't have a Voter Card you can vote a secret challenged ballot. If you forget your SEPTA pass, but have your driver's license, you can also vote a challenged ballot. Challenged ballots will be counted regardless of the outcome of the election.

If you run into a problem, call the Election Committee at the Union Hall.

AS IN THE PAST, THE BALLOTS WILL BE OPENED AND COUNTED BY REPRESENTATIVES OF THE AMERICAN ARBITRATION ASSOCIATION.
