## Current

I am an active member of the UBCIC and was appointed to many committees over the years which include the Constitution Committee, Indigenous Membership & Citizenship, Specific Claims, All Chief's Task Force, First Nations Technology Council, and more recently the Children & Families Working Group, Provincial Commitment Working Group and in addition provide liaison support to many various organizations such as Missing Murdered Women's Coalition, First Nations Emergency Services Society, BC Small Business Roundtable, Wild Salmon Alliance, Rural BC Initiative, Southern Mountain Pine Beetle Action Coalition, Interior Alliance etc. At the national level, I have served on the AFN Comprehensive Claims working group including various ad hoc committees and policy and legislation joint working groups as needed.
