I also grew up around my grandparents who taught me to be respectful to everyone and treat all women and men equally, I was taught to help those who were unable to help themselves. I did so many things with my grandparents from a young age that made me who I am today from chopping wood to working in the hay field or making sure our family horses were taken care of. They were some of the most influential people in my life and I hope more youth spend time with their grandparents while they can.

I would like to put my name forward for the Union of BC Indian Chiefs (UBCIC) Youth Representative. The mandate of the UBCIC is to get recognition of our inherent right to our title and rights and to protect our land and water and to strengthen all nations to assert their own title and rights by working together and having one voice together and the constitution talks about the importance of education, woman, youth and elders. The woman's representative goes to meetings and reports on issues and files concerning women area so I believe that I would do the same and my role would be:
