Travel Reimbursement

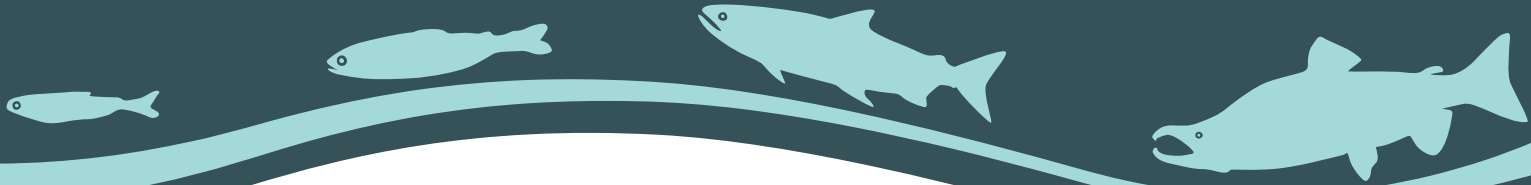
