In the wake of the horrific findings at the former Kamloops Indian Residential School site, Ahousaht contacted Kukpi, Rosanne Casmir expressing our support to the Nation and All other nations whose children attended that school.

Chief Councillor, Greg Louie, “There were two Indian Residential Schools in Ahousaht territory: Ahousat Residential School: 1904 to 1940 and the Christie Indian Residential School: 1900 -1983. Children from many nations attended these two schools; many did not return home for many months, while only a few hundred metres or a few kilometres from their homes. While at the schools, the children were treated atrociously. These truths are being revealed.” Stories are shared of children who died while at these schools and the parents were not told the reasoning for the death of their child. Other stories share that babies were born to children at the school and the babies were not seen after their birth.

Ahousaht calls on the Federal Government and the Provincial Governments to provide the resources to Ahousaht and All Nations to conduct Ground Penetrating Radar Imaging AND resources to identify remains found to return home where possible and provide resources for healing for each Nation.

The Federal Government must fully implement the 94 calls to Action set out in by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC) and fully implement the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP).
