Dear Maureen Buchan and Andrea Glickman:

As you know, the Attorney General has been considering introducing possible legislative measures aimed at increasing protections with respect to the non-consensual disclosure of intimate images (NCDII). Please see link here:

NCDII is a form of online and sexual violence that can have significant impacts on those affected. Although it is a criminal offence, some other jurisdictions in Canada have adopted civil legislation in an effort to create more trauma-informed and survivor-driven processes and remedies. Recognizing that NCDII is a form of gender-based violence that may have a disproportionate impact on Indigenous women and girls, as the Attorney General continues to consider introducing NCDII legislation, I am writing to provide an opportunity for your organization to engage on this issue, provide guidance, and ask questions.
