- Any Rabbis on campus and their families
- RAG (Raising and Giving) Society
- Sports Society
- Do you have any friends connected to any society? Ask them!

- Are you lucky enough to be at uni on a beach? Do a beach clean-up!
- Ask around what did your J-Soc do last year?
