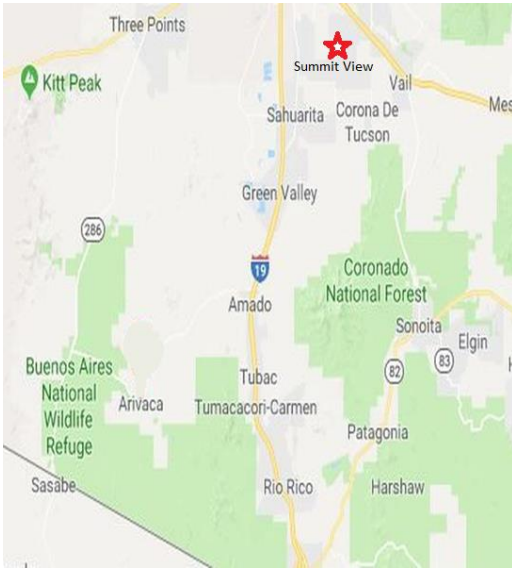

Geographic Information

- Summit View is located outside of metro Tucson, AZ. about 2 miles south of Tucson International Airport. Population is 8,125.
- Summit View lacks transportation infrastructure, as many roads in the neighborhood are unpaved. Much of the traffic through the area is pedestrians walking to and from the park, school and small markets.
- Poverty in Summit View reflects individuals and families living significantly below the poverty level. In comparison to Pima County the annual household income is less than \$29,000 per year.
