BUSINESS+EDUCATION PARTNERSHIPS & L.A. YOUTH AT WORK

Career Pathways in LACOE Probation Camps

- *Acquired four additional career pathways at County Probation Camps: Graphic Communications pathway at Willows County Community School; Health Science pathway at Mujeres y Hombres County Community School; and Building Construction pathways at McAuliffe and Mendenhall Juvenile Camp Schools.*

Career Pathways in LAUSD

- *Added new **Linked Learning** pathways at Reseda High School's Biomedical Magnet and Bell High School's Multicultural Teaching Academy. Total number of students served by UNITE-LA Linked Learning career specialists: 3,187.*



South L.A. Scholars

- *Over 120 students completed their paid summer youth work experience, exploring career pathways in healthcare. Quotes from South L.A. Students:*
 - *"My summer job experience was amazing! It was like an adventure around the hospital. I would either be in the provider's office, the laboratory, or the medical consultant's office...Being able to be part of the medical team was my goal for the summer and I accomplished it. Thanks for the opportunity."*
 - *"I got to learn how to fax and scan and take phone calls....It really helped out my anxiety and shyness. I also got to talk to and help out patients. I really got out of my shell this summer because of this internship."*

L.A. Youth at Work (LAYAW)

- *L.A. Youth at Work trained 62 Summer Night Light squad leaders, 26 community partners, and 18 LAUSD Pupil Services Counselors (who counsel formerly-incarcerated youth) to teach Job Skills Workshops (JSWs) and host Work Readiness Certifications (WRCs).*
- *592 youth attended JSWs and 391 earned WRCs.*
- *LAYAW partnered with Cedars Sinai, Kaiser Permanente, L.A. Metro, Parsons, and Metropolitan Water District to place 159 youth into paid summer internships.*



COLLABORATION & INNOVATION

L.A. Compact

- *The L.A. Compact brought together Los Angeles Community College District's (LACCD) Chancellor Rodriguez and its nine college presidents with LAUSD's Supt. King and its six local district superintendents to discuss collaboration on the L.A. College Promise and other college access priorities. L.A. College Promise kicked off at L.A. City College in a celebration featuring Dr. Jill Biden, Second Lady of the U.S. and Honorary Chair of the national College Promise Campaign.*
- *As part of the L.A. Performance Partnership Pilot (LA P3), the City and County Workforce Development programs, L.A. Chamber, and Alliance for Children's Rights expanded outreach to 20 year-olds aging out of the foster system to receive priority enrollment at Youth Source Centers.*



The L.A. Regional STEM Hub participated at the 2016 California STEM Symposium on the panel, "Creating STEM Ecosystems." Southern California ecosystems provided overviews on their respective STEM networks and highlighted emerging themes, similarities, differences, and impacts across their communities.
