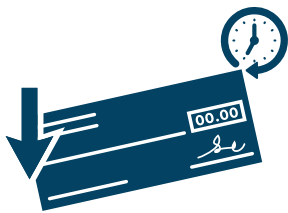
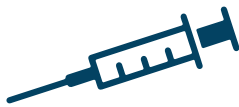

EVERYONE, NO MATTER THEIR IMMIGRATION SITUATION, CAN ACCESS TREATMENT, TESTING, AND OTHER CARE FOR COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS). PUBLIC CHARGE, A TEST APPLIED TO SOME GREEN CARD APPLICANTS AND OTHERS SEEKING A VISA, DOES NOT CONSIDER USE OF HEALTH SERVICES FOR COVID-19.



If you are applying for a green card or visa and are subject to a public charge test, seeking healthcare services for the coronavirus **will not impact your immigration case.**

You can also explain how reduced hours, job loss, and related financial difficulties were caused by the coronavirus and they **will not negatively impact you** if you are subject to a public charge test.
