The answers to the survey were graded to reflect which candidates are arts and humanities friendly. An "A" grade reflects that candidates have positions friendly towards arts and humanities in regards to education, tax distribution, and in seeing the Cultural Sector of Utah as a viable part of Utah's economy. The grades continue from there with an "F" grade representing candidates with platforms that threaten public support for arts and culture in education, arts and culture in the community, and whose platforms pose a threat to those working in the cultural sector. For grading the candidates, only questions with fixed answers were graded. Free response questions could not be graded objectively, and therefore were not used in the final grades. Each question had a varying weight for quantitative scores and then these scores were added up for each letter grade.

Question weights
#9 5 points for yes, O for no
#11, 12 and 14. 3 for increase spending, 1 for keep the same, O for decrease
#13 and 15. 4 for yes, 1 for unsure, O for no
#16, 17, and 19. 2 for yes, O for unsure, O for no.

The grades were then based on the following points A=24 - 31, B=21-24, C=18-20, D=16-17 F=15 or below.

However, some non-profit organizations still have to pay property taxes on their real estate to continue to support local schools. I'd have to review the precise fiscal impact of the bill to know whether or not it makes sense.

I think historic preservation needs to strike a balance with the needs of the community in which it occurs. Certain historic monuments need preservation against future potential redevelopment, but others may act as more of a long-term weight on the community without providing much economic or cultural benefit. I think it's difficult to approach the issue with a broad brush, but historical preservation is certainly an important issue that should receive the support it needs to move forward without too many barriers.

My undergraduate degree is in the humanities, and I try to encourage my children to participate in artistic and cultural pursuits whenever the opportunity arises.
