December's massive Thomas Fire impacted our community in so many devastating ways - including dramatically changing the landscape surrounding our town. Not only did hundreds of people lose their homes and memories, but also thousands of acres of critical wilderness and wildlife habitat were lost.

At the Big Rock Preserve, blackened branches, ashes and soot now are where there were once scenic trails, an abundance of wildlife and thousands of beautiful plants and trees. Although the land has been scarred, we know that, with help, nature's wounds will heal over time.
