

Petition Circulator DOs

- DO** circulate the petition if you are: at least 18 years old, a Michigan resident, and eligible to register to vote.
- DO** gather valid signatures from registered Michigan voters who vote in the county indicated at the top of the petition.
- DO** feel free to circulate petitions on public property. See: <http://www.aclumich.org/know-your-petitioning-rights-frequently-asked-questions>.
- DO** be courteous and smile when asking people to sign the petition.
- DO** ask people if they have already signed the redistricting reform petition.
- DO** watch as each person signs the petition, and if they make a mistake, help them make corrections in the appropriate manner.
- DO** ask for phone and email from each signer, especially the first on each sheet.
- DO** sign and complete all the information on the Circulator Certificate only after you are done collecting on that sheet.
- DO** return petitions to your captain, even if some spaces are still blank.

Petition Circulator DON'Ts

- DON'T** misrepresent or make false statements about what is in the petition or the purpose of the petition.
- DON'T** refuse to allow potential signers to read the petition on request.
- DON'T** offer money or any other item of value in exchange for signatures.
- DON'T** let anyone else circulate or obtain signatures on your petition.
- DON'T** circulate petitions on any private property without permission from the property owner or manager.
- DON'T** block or obstruct any walkways, passageways, driveways, streets, or sidewalks while circulating on public property.
- DON'T** hesitate to call the police immediately if any serious problems occur that might involve any threat to any person or property.
- DON'T** lose your cool if confronted by individuals who are trying to convince people not to sign the petition.
- DON'T** circulate or promote the initiative within 100 feet of any polling place entrance.

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

In general, circulators have the right to collect signatures in public areas and sidewalks. Please consult with local ordinances to make sure you are in compliance with all rules and regulations. If someone asks you to leave a public area, politely ask their name, contact information and what ordinance or statute they are relying on to demand you leave the area. Promptly notify your captain of the situation and follow your captain's instructions on how to best handle the situation. You are not required to give out any personal information.
