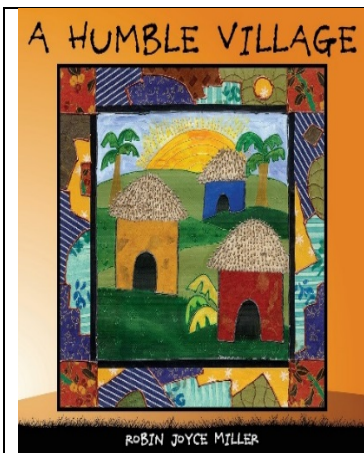
Title: I Know an Old Mzee Who Swallowed a Fly...In Uganda!

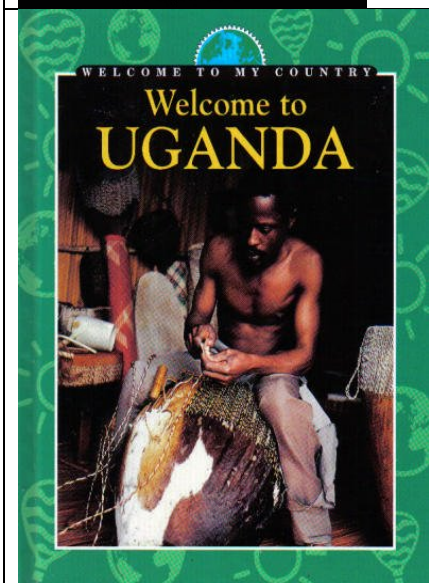
Title: How the Crane Got Its Crown: A Ugandan Folk Tale

Summary: This was a wonderful basic-level overview of Uganda's history, government, and culture. The author provides very simple descriptions and explanations of the features of the Ugandan flag, its rivers and lakes, its plants and animals, and its history (including the terrible years of Milton Obote and then Idi Amin). She briefly mentions the existence of child soldiers, but does not explain that they are kidnapped from their families and forced to fight in the rebel LRA army. This may be a bit too much for young adult nonfiction.
