Job Title: Summer Fellow

Position Type: 8 weeks full time

Job Summary

Walk Bike Nashville, a 501(c)3 with a mission to make the Nashville area more walkable, bikeable, and liveable. We are seeking a full-time fellow to join us for 8-weeks in summer 2020 to assist with data-related research projects for summer 2020.

In 2020 Walk Bike Nashville won a grant from SPIN, which has given us access to a number of data tools including a membership to Streetlight and Populus, a radar gun, a time lapse video camera and bike-pedestrian count sensor. We are looking for a summer fellow with a background in urban planning, transportation planning, or transportation engineering to assist with research, data collection, analysis and reporting.

The summer fellow will help use these data tools to support advocacy campaigns underway at Walk Bike Nashville. In addition we hope the fellow will be able to help us develop additional research questions to investigate throughout the summer using the data tools and other publicly available information.

Qualifications

Eligibility: Any current undergraduate or graduate students or recent graduates interested in transportation, urban planning, and public policy are eligible. Students enrolled in programs related to transportation planning, urban planning, public policy, public administration, urban design, and urban studies are the most likely fit, though we believe students of all backgrounds can make a contribution to our organization.

Desired skills: Strong writing and communication skills. Excellent critical thinking, research, and analytical skills. Knowledge of multimodal transportation planning and best practices. Experience with spatial analysis, statistics and working with datasets, or survey techniques is a plus.

Compensation

- 8 weeks full-time work between June and August 2020, depending on schedule and availability of fellow.
