Watermain Replacement on Avenue Road from Bloor Street West to Lowther Avenue

Expected Start Date: September, 2015

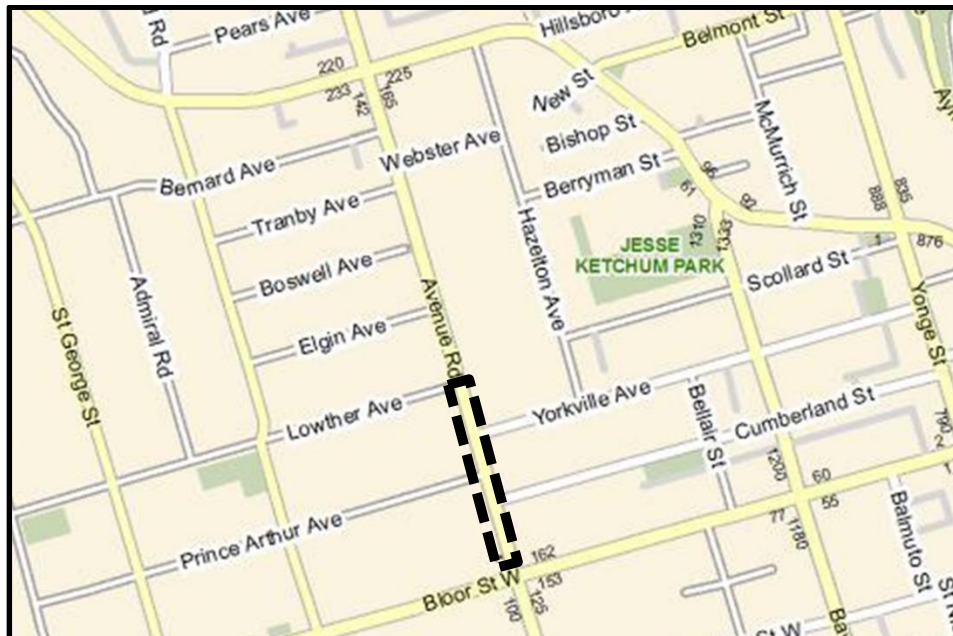
Expected End Date: December 2015

The City of Toronto is planning to replace the watermain and the City-owned portion of substandard water services on Avenue Road from Bloor Street West to Lowther Avenue in the fall.

The water service is the underground pipe that brings water to your water meter and is owned by you and by the City. The part you own is from your house to the end of your property, the part the City owns is from the property line to the water main. This project is part of the Council-approved 2015 Capital Works Program that will improve water distribution and the City's aging infrastructure while reducing the risk of watermain breaks and improving water distribution to your property in larger diameter pipes.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- A Construction Notice will be delivered to affected properties approximately two weeks before work begins with an exact start date and details about the work.
- Further notice will be provided to property owners who must remove items located within City

property limits (boulevard), such as decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager listed below.

- Work will take place in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties. This work includes removing and replacing driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.
- Before work begins, crews will mark sidewalks and curbs to be replaced, and underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable to ensure construction work doesn't interrupt the utilities.

	<p>Substandard Water Service Replacement: Please read the attached fact sheet as it contains important information about lead in drinking water and water service replacement. If you live in a house that was built before the mid-1950s, your water service may be made of lead. Find out if your water service is lead – a licensed plumber can help you with this. If it is lead, the City of Toronto encourages you to replace it. We recommend you obtain several quotes and you can contact the City's contractor for one of your quotes. Approximately two weeks prior to construction you will receive a "Construction Notice" with the name and phone number of the City contractor. Learn more at www.toronto.ca/leadpipes</p>
