#### DONATE TO SCHOOLS FOR REUSE

- Yarn, knitting needles, sewing notions, buttons and keys
- Children's books, musical instruments
- CD's, CD cases, 35 mm cameras
- Costume jewellery including broken, old watches
- Arts and crafts supplies (pencils, crayons, markers etc)
- Corks, cork boards, clipboards
- Dress up clothing (costumes, prom dresses, uniforms)

#### DONATE FOR REUSE

- Sporting goods (e.g. skates, hockey equipment, bikes, rackets)
- Books (excluding school/university curriculum books)
- Eyeglasses, walking aids, hearing aids, etc.
- Small household items (e.g. dishes, ornaments, kitchen utensils, artistic drawings, games, etc.)
- Textiles in good condition (e.g. clothing, linens, etc.)
- Non-perishable foods will be donated to a food bank

All donated items must be in very good condition

**Please do not bring: construction waste, gasoline, garbage, wood, cassette and videotapes, commercial/industrial hazardous waste and scrap metal.**
