We will discuss potential scale and form of new development, heritage preservation, public space and streetscape enhancements, as well as potential improvements to pedestrian and cycling connections.

This meeting will be a collaborative exercise to assist City Planning staff in understanding the strengths and opportunities of the Bloor Street West corridor.
