
Study Overview

In 2012, the City of Toronto completed the Waterfront Sanitary Servicing Master Plan Class Environmental Assessment (EA), which identified a preferred strategy to provide sanitary servicing for development along Toronto's central waterfront to 2031.

The City is undertaking an EA study to update the 2012 Master Plan. This EA study will identify a new preferred sanitary servicing strategy for the central waterfront, taking into consideration the strong development growth along the waterfront, updated sanitary servicing needs, and projects from completed studies (e.g. Don River and Central Waterfront Wet Weather Flow System, the Integrated Pumping Station, Servicing Report for Lower Don Lands and Port Lands) that offer an opportunity to integrate infrastructure.

The Process

The Study is being undertaken following the Master Planning provisions as set out in the Municipal Class EA document (amended in 2007, 2011 and 2015). The Master Planning process involves identifying the problem/opportunity, developing and evaluating alternative solutions, and recommending a preferred solution.
