SUBJECT: Item 13: Consideration of a resolution to award a contract to the San Gabriel Valley

Conservation Corps for US Forest Service Special Project 15-PA-11050100-020 Mod 2

RECOMMENDATION: That the Watershed Conservation Authority Governing Board authorize the award of a contract to the San Gabriel Valley Conservation Corps for US Forest Service Special Project 15-PA-11050100-020 Mod 2 for an amount not to exceed \$112,000.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The contract with San Gabriel Valley Conservation Corps (SGVCC) will support youth engagement and natural and recreational resource management within the San Gabriel Mountains National Monument (SGMNM) and the Angeles National Forest (ANF). These projects may include recreation site restoration, watershed restoration, trail restoration, environmental education training in leave no trace principles, invasive plant and graffiti removal, and providing as needed support services under the direction of ANF staff. ANF staff requested WCA to utilize the federal funding set aside through the Master Participating Agreement and this SPA to continue the ANF Environmental Restoration – Job Training and Youth Development program with SGVCC through June 30, 2020.

BACKGROUND: In 2015, the Governing Board, Resolution 15-27, authorized the Watershed Conservation Authority (WCA) to enter into a Master Participating Agreement (MPA) with Angeles National Forest (ANF) to develop and implement a comprehensive master development plan for the San Gabriel Canyon Improvement Project Area (Exhibit A). The Project Area is the main gateway to the San Gabriel Mountains National Monument (Monument) and encompasses some of the most heavily utilized recreational destinations, as well as, including both the WCA's River Wilderness Park and Mt Baldy Preserve property. The SGC Project focuses on visitor access, amenities and utilization of recreational opportunities within the region.

The MPA provides authorization from both parties to jointly work together to forward projects within the SGC Project Area. Through the execution of individual Supplemental Project Agreements, ANF and WCA work collaboratively to complete projects and programs that forward the goals and objectives of the Monument, ANF and WCA within the SGC Project Area.

US Forest Service Supplemental Project Agreement (SPA) 15-PA-11050100-020, Modification 2 obligated up to \$125,000 to be spent on youth engagement projects (Exhibit B: SPA). Over the years, ANF has worked closely with local Conservation Corps to mitigate human impact on public lands by engaging them in partnerships that will not only educate and train youth and young adults to practice conservation but will also accomplish much needed restoration tasks that help protect forest resources. These projects may include but are not limited to pollution abatement, recreation site restoration, watershed restoration, trail restoration, environmental education, forestry protection and youth job training and development.

Since 2014, ANF has utilized the San Gabriel Valley Conservation Corps youth via a separate participating agreement to provide restore and enhance forest resources. The most current ANF agreement with SGVCC completed its term on October 1, 2019.

Staff recommends approval to enter into an agreement with SGVCC to provide services under the SPA 15-PA-11050100-020; Mod 2, to be completed within the San Gabriel Canyon Improvement Project Area and including Mt Baldy Habitat Preserve. Exhibit C: Draft Scope of Work, Timeline and Budget.

FISCAL INFORMATION: This action will have fiscal effect to FY19/20 operating budget, the contract agreement of up to \$112,000 will utilize federal funding obligated under US Forest Service Special Projects Agreement (SPA) 15-PA-11050100-020 Mod 2. The hourly Rate for Crew and Crew Lead members is \$30/hour which is a fully burdened rate that is inclusive of insurances and overhead, as well as, mileage.

Territory Map: San Gabriel Canyon Improvements Project

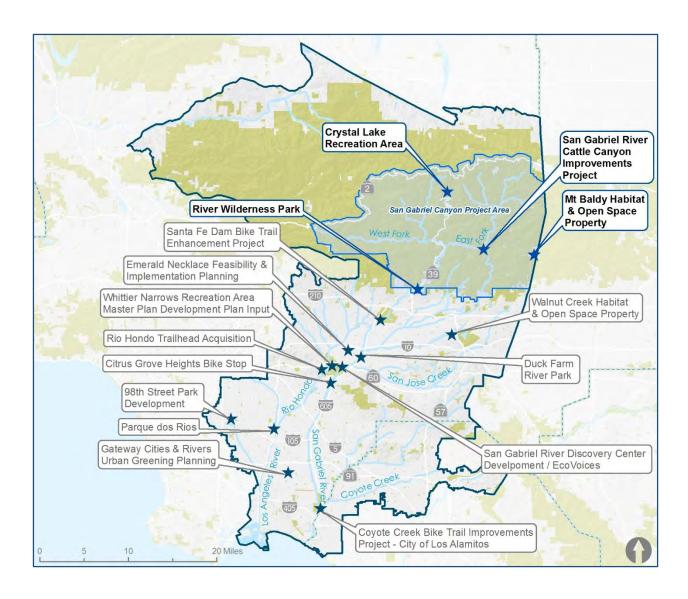

Exhibit A: SCOPE OF WORK

Job Training – Recreation and Trail Restoration Project: Project accomplishment targets will include:

Recreation Crews: SGV Corps crews will work on, but not limited to, recreation sites, cleaning up
trash along dispersed areas, fixing and improving recreation facilities, removing graffiti,
removing invasive plants, public outreach and environmental education, and support services
and restoring trails within the San Gabriel Canyon Improvement Project Area. The US Forest
Service field contact for work within ANF will be Mike Hansen, Assistant Recreation Officer or
designee. WCA field contact will be Alex Linz, Project Manager or designee.

Timeline:

• The expectation is that the crews will work until funding is exhausted or complete before June 30, 2020 whichever occurs first. Base crew size will be 1 supervisor and 4 crew members, 8 hour shifts and up to 4 days a week. Crew size and number of days a week are subject to change based on support needs of ANF and weather conditions.

Supplies/Materials:

The field contact will identify and provide supplies and materials for each project as needed.
The SGV Corps will ensure that Corps members are adequately equipped and trained to work in
the forest and on WCA lands with Personal Protective Equipment, water, and necessary tools. In
unique instances ANF or WCA may loan tools to the SGV Corps while on the project site, which
will remain the property of the entity loaning the tools.

Uniforms:

SGV Corps will provide uniforms that meet all safety specifications of the US Forest Service.

Funding:

Funding for this project shall not exceed \$112,000. Hourly Rate for Crew and Crew Lead members is \$30/hour which is a fully burdened rate that is inclusive of insurances and overhead, as well as, mileage.
