Frank Quarisa, Toronto Water, a division of the City of Toronto

Frank has been the Director of Wastewater Treatment in Toronto Water for the past 11 years. In this role he oversees the operations and capital planning needs of the City's four wastewater treatment plants. Frank oversees a department of over 330 staff, an annual Operations Budget of over \$110M and an annual Capital Budget of about \$150M. Prior to joining the City of Toronto, Frank was Vice President of Project Development and Technical Services with the Ontario Clean Water Agency (OCWA); and, before that the Agency's operations General Manager of the South Peel Water and Wastewater System. Frank started his water and wastewater career in the Project Engineering Branch of the MOE and moved to OCWA at its inception in 1993. He has a Bachelor of Civil Engineering degree from McGill University and an MBA from York University's Schulich School of Business
