


May 14 is International Birding Day.

Turn an invasive species into a delicious treat!



Garlic mustard is an invasive herb native to Europe. It spreads quickly, and interferes with the growth of other plants in the area including several species at risk. While it is not a good food source for wildlife, it is high in vitamins A and C, and makes fantastic pesto.



### Did you know?

You can hike the trails from Guelph to Tobermory or Queenston. The Radial Line Trail leaves Guelph along our rivers and in 33 kilometers joins the Bruce Trail at Limehouse. From there, if you turn South you can walk all the way to Queenston on the Niagara River. If you turn north, you can walk all the way to Tobermory at the tip of the Bruce Peninsula.


## CYCLING TOUR OF RIVERSIDE GARDENS... AND A PINT




CRAYFISH CATCHING IN THE SPEED

### Did you know?

The Speed and Eramosa Rivers are two of four river tributaries to the Grand River that are designated as Canadian Heritage Rivers, the other two being the Nith and The Conestoga. Both rivers flow into the Grand River, which flows into Lake Erie. The entire Grand River Watershed is about the size of Prince Edward Island.






## University of Guelph Arboretum Bioblitz



## Did you know?

There are over 300 different bird species that have been recorded in the Grand River Watershed of which the Eramosa and Speed Rivers are a significant part. 65 of these bird species are considered to be rare in Ontario and 31 are considered to be at risk in Ontario and/or in Canada.


