

Resolution Urging Federal and State Representatives and Senators of the YOUR LD# or Organization to Support Single-Payer Healthcare

Whereas the Patient Protection & Affordable Care Act of 2010 (ACA) does not provide health coverage for millions of U.S. residents, and

Whereas single-payer health care bills have been introduced in both the House and Senate of Washington state and did not come out of committee, and

Whereas there is an active bill in the United States House of Representatives, HR 676, Expanded & Improved Medicare for All, that would provide health coverage for all U.S. residents at considerably lower cost, and

Whereas a single-payer health care bills is being drafted for the United States Senate, and

Whereas recent public opinion polls find support for such a plan to be well above 50% among all voters (and 81% among Democrats), and

Whereas the public outcry against the AHCA offers a great opportunity to educate the public about a superior solution to the need to move on beyond the ACA to full universal health coverage in the U.S., and

Whereas the platform of the Washington State Democrats calls for “An affordable universal single-payer system to provide the most equitable and effective health care, serving both individual and public health needs...”

Therefore, be it resolved that the **YOUR LD#** Legislative District Democrats ask our state Representatives **YOUR 1ST STATE REP** and **YOUR 2ND STATE REP** and Senator **YOUR STATE SENATOR** to support universal single-payer health care bills and initiatives in Washington.

Be it further resolved that we urge Representative **YOUR CONGRESSIONAL REP NAME** (WA-**YOUR CD #**) to vocally support and Co-Sponsor HR 676, Expanded & Improved Medicare for All.

Be it further resolved that we urge Senator Patty Murray and Senator Maria Cantwell to co-sponsor and advocate a universal single-payer healthcare bill being drafted in the senate.

Be it finally resolved that the executive board, PCOs, and membership of the **YOUR LD#** request above mentioned representatives respond upon receipt of this resolution.
