The China FTA and Australian jobs

- The Abbott Government has signed a new trade deal with China – the China Free Trade Agreement (FTA)
- This agreement will be bad for jobs, and bad for local communities
- Unemployment is already too high: youth unemployment is at 13.5% nationally, and in parts of Queensland, Victoria and NSW is as high as 20%
- Under the China FTA, Chinese companies will be able to bring in workers from overseas and NOT have to offer these jobs to locals first
- Overseas workers who come to Australia are already being exploited
- Under the China FTA this will only get worse – a Chinese company and the government will be able to decide:
 - * what workers will be paid
 - * decide how much of that they will return to the employer for accommodation
 - * what level of English is required, if any.
- These arrangements exploit overseas workers, and potentially put their lives and the lives of others at risk. Good safety demands good communication.

The Abbott government has agreed that many tradies who come into Australia will not need to be qualified. These include:

- ***** Carpenters
- ***** Cabinetmakers
- **X** Carpenters and joiners
- **★** Diesel motor mechanics

- ***** Motor mechanics
- ***** Electricians
- The China FTA will kill local jobs and put lives at risk
- Everyone needs to unite to fight the China FTA:
 - Local workers whose jobs will be lost
 - Overseas workers who are being exploited
 - Local communities who are under threat from the loss of local jobs
- Say NO to Exploitation
- Say YES to local jobs.
