



Workplace Justice Summer Internships (unpaid - Rochester and Kingston office)

The Worker Justice Center of New York pursues justice for those denied human rights, with a focus on agricultural and other low-wage workers, through legal representation, community empowerment and advocacy for institutional change. The organization is currently seeking interns for the fall semester to support its Workplace Justice Program. Internships may be based in WJCNY's offices in either Rochester or Kingston.

Job Title: Workplace Justice Intern

Schedule: Flexible scheduling is available.

Compensation: This internship position is unpaid. WJCNY will, however, work with colleges and universities for interns to receive credit and/or institutional support when possible.

Internship Summary: The Workplace Justice Intern will work directly with the Worker Justice Center staff on a variety of legal, advocacy, and community engagement matters. Assignments include assisting with outreach to farmworkers and other low-wage workers, educational workshops, community events, translating documents and materials, assisting with client communications, conducting general administrative tasks, assisting with worker advocacy efforts, and conducting related research.

Internship Requirements:

- Spanish language proficiency (strongly preferred)
- A commitment to social justice issues
- Computer proficiency
