<p>7. Greenspace Committee</p>	<p>Plant sale raised \$500ish. Still waiting on the TD environment grant however Cindy Gilroy has agreed to fund gardens through land development fund even if grant doesn't come through. If grant does come through that could be put to use at Omand's Creek or Telford Green.</p> <p>Community Garden materials are an estimated \$20,000-\$22,000. Gardeners will need to pay fees to cover water costs.</p> <p>Committee is in the process of figuring out how plot lottery will be done. Possible % just for those in apartments.</p> <p>Lots of orange dots in Wolesley Vimy will be hard hit as there are lots of ash.</p> <p>Erna, Chris Green and Pat? Met in april for info on how to replace blvd trees.</p>	

	<p>50 or so people participated in the releaf program</p> <p>Committee is considering polling the neighborhood on what they need from their greenspace plans.</p> <p>We may tie an event to the lottery of the community gardens Erna follow up with Chairs of greenspace committee possible workshops on seedling. Garden panning etc.</p> <p>possibly some sort of forum on the trees and the urban canopy in general maybe pitch that the city should advocate for federal money to protect the trees?</p>	
<p>8. Housing and Urban Devel Committee</p>	<p>Ken has been looking into an efficiency workshop with MB Hydro but with the state of Covid19 this will need to be a virtual event.</p> <p>Also wants to discuss zoning bylaws and secondary plans(what can get built where) The possibilities for infill development were not developed with Wolesley's neighbourhood character in mind.</p> <p>Feels that the city issues need to be brought into focus. Is also looking for more volunteers for the committee. It was suggested that the committee members are most likely to come from those who were interested in attending the virtual event.</p>	
<p>9. Other items</p>	<p>Bridge Proposal. Marianne was contacted by Peter Rempel who had a proposal to improve the Omands Creek bridge. The bridge has had contentious plans made for and against it for quite some time. WRA suggests that Mr. Rempel would be welcome to take this to the Parks office at the city.</p> <p>Cynthia suggested that depending on how the river freezes that we lobby the city for a skate corridor to Assiniboine Park. Another good active transportation route for winter.</p>	

	<p>The event on September 21<sup>st</sup> needs to be advertised more within the community. It is a zoom event. We would like several posters in the community. Sascha has a contact at CBC perhaps we can get on up to speed?</p> <p>We need to make applications for per capita grants. This would cover things like insurance and website hosting costs.</p>
