[The Price of Honor](#) is a multi-award winning documentary film about the murders of Amina and Sarah Said, teenage sisters from Texas who were killed in a premeditated "honor killing" in 2008 by their father, Yaser Said, who fled the crime scene and remains at large. This film aims to bring awareness to the global issue of honor violence and to raise the bar on how social services and law enforcement handle honor violence in the United States.



[Amy Logan](#) is a global women's human rights activist and Consulting Producer of *The Price of Honor*. She is Co-President of UN Women's San Francisco Bay Area chapter and author of *The Seven Perfumes of Sacrifice*, a novel about the search for the ancient, lost origins of honor killings. She has been lauded by former Egyptian First Lady Jihan Sadat and has given presentations at TedxSacramento, the UN Foundation, USNC-UN Women LA and SF, USC, NYU, Oxford and Gediz University in Turkey. She serves on the Advisory Board of Women's Voices Now.
