

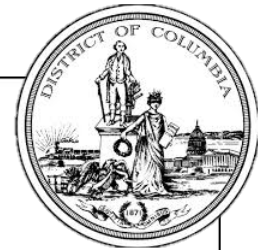

Identify the issue

Strategic framing

This is a rhetorical tool [for persuading people] to view this issue from your perspective. When we 'frame' an issue, we decide how we want to talk about this issue. What are the causes? What are the important affects? Think about your word-choice as you describe the issue.

Now you are ready to frame your issue!

How does this impact the kids in your classroom and their families?

What are the larger consequences of this issue if it does not get fixed or address in some way?

What is your suggested remedy?

You may not have an answer here, that's fine! Solving complicated issues usually require systemic change. But, it's more powerful when you show that you provide some ideas to get started. Think big or think small, what could the city do to help address these issue(s)?

What changes do you believe can improve the situation? What would your school do with a fairer budget?

What could your school do with a fairer budget (more resources)?
