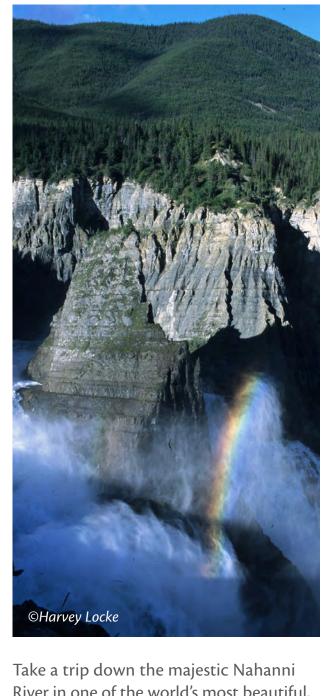

Wolverine lantern tour LOCATION: Tumbler Ridge, B.C. DIFFICULTY LEVEL: easy SUITABLE FOR: all ages SEASON: all seasons WILDLIFE: fossils and tracks of past wildlife

Take part in a magical tour of dinosaur trackways with the Tumbler Ridge Museum Foundation in Tumbler Ridge, B.C. Head out into the night on a guided tour with a low-angled lantern light, which brings out the fossilized dinosaur footprints not visible in the light of day.

Hiking Monkman Pass LOCATION: Monkman Provincial Park, B.C. DIFFICULTY LEVEL: moderate to extreme SUITABLE FOR: adults SEASON: all seasons WILDLIFE: wolverine, fisher, caribou, grizzly bear Climb into the high alpine of the Wild Hart

mountains, a bridge between intact wild alpine forests. The Monkman trail system takes you along a jaw-dropping series of thundering cascades and waterfalls, frothing rapids and tranquil lakes. B.C. program manager, Tim Burkhart, cites this as one

of his most memorable activities in the Yellowstone to Yukon region.

Hike Maligne Canyon LOCATION: Jasper National Park, AB DIFFICULTY LEVEL: moderate SUITABLE FOR: all ages SEASON: summer WILDLIFE: grizzly bear, wolf, lynx, mountain goat, caribou

As you make your way along the trail experiencing natural springs, abundant forest and wildlife, you'll find yourself at one of the most interesting canyons in the Canadian Rockies. Unlike most water-carved canyons, Maligne Canyon is narrower at the top than it is partway down. The trail culminates in dramatic views where you'll find yourself surrounded by the artistry of nature.

Glacier exploration LOCATION: Columbia Icefield between Jasper and Banff national parks, AB DIFFICULTY LEVEL: easy to moderate SUITABLE FOR: all ages SEASON: all seasons WILDLIFE: mountain goat, bighorn sheep, pika, hoary marmot

Walking on a glacier is one of the most epic strolls you'll ever take. The Yellowstone to Yukon region is rich in glaciers providing drinking water to some 15 million people and countless species of wildlife. Here you can experience one of these glaciers for yourself. Walk the Columbia Icefield glacier on a three-hour tour or explore it on a bus with tires specially designed to cross ice.





Pulsatilla Pass backcountry backpacking LOCATION: Banff National Park, AB DIFFICULTY LEVEL: extreme SUITABLE FOR: adults SEASON: summer WILDLIFE: grizzly bear, wolf, lynx, elk, black bear



Take a six- to eight-day backpacking journey through the backcountry of the Yellowstone to Yukon region, in an area well-known for its amazing wildflowers. Decompress, re-center and come back to the world filled with energy and the beauty of the landscape.

Kootenay hot springs LOCATION: East and West Kootenays, B.C. DIFFICULTY LEVEL: easy SUITABLE FOR: all ages SEASON: all seasons WILDLIFE: wild turkey, bighorn sheep, moose, elk, mountain goat, whitetail deer, black bear, cougar

After a long day of skiing, hiking, paddling or climbing, take a relaxing dip in one of the many natural hot springs the Kootenays have to offer. Breathe in the natural minerals long claimed to have healing properties. Most hot spring locations have cold pools or rivers to refresh your body between satisfying soaks.



thrill of downhill skiing along with some of the most striking towns in the Yellowstone to Yukon region. Known for its incredible snowpack, the Kootenays are a skiing haven, but intense precipitation also plays a critical role in freshwater storage, supporting many animals and plants that live in the region. Fat biking at Syncline crosscountry ski area LOCATION: Castle Provincial Park, AB DIFFICULTY LEVEL: moderate SUITABLE FOR: ages 10 and up

SEASON: winter WILDLIFE: moose, wolf, wolverine, elk, cougar

Burn some winter calories fat biking through fun trails in the West Castle. It's a great way to shake off cabin fever and get out into the fresh air. Whether you're an experienced rider or teaching your kids to shred, this area is a mountain biker's paradise.

Butcher Lake fishing LOCATION: outside Pincher Creek, AB DIFFICULTY LEVEL: easy to moderate SUITABLE FOR: all ages SEASON: summer and early fall WILDLIFE: brook trout, grizzly bear, black bear, elk

Whether you're solo or with a group of friends and family, fishing is one of the most enjoyable experiences you can have in the Yellowstone to Yukon region. Catch your shore lunch of brook trout and take in the scenic views from the water. Be sure to check out the many local tackle shops.



Tamarack Trail LOCATION: Waterton Lakes National Park, AB DIFFICULTY LEVEL: extreme SUITABLE FOR: adults SEASON: summer WILDLIFE: elk, bighorn sheep, mule deer, black bear, grizzly bear, cougar, coyote It's a 20-mile (32-kilometer) backpacking

loop best enjoyed over three to four days. The trip climaxes along the Continental Divide, with incredible panoramic views of the Rocky Mountains as you gaze west into B.C. and south into Glacier National Park, as well as eastern prairie vistas. It's an awe-inspiring journey. Former Y2Y executive director, Wendy Francis, points to this special activity as one of her favorites.

Take an illuminating tour of one of the largest known limestone caverns in the northwest U.S. and experience this geological wonder. Tours vary in length and difficulty so check which one is right for you. Access to the caves is by guided tour only and camping is available not far from the banks of the Jefferson River.

Float the Middle Fork and Main Salmon Rivers LOCATION: central ID DIFFICULTY LEVEL: moderate SUITABLE FOR: all ages SEASON: summer WILDLIFE: bull trout, rainbow trout, bighorn sheep, elk, black bear, roughed grouse

Backcountry ski or split-board LOCATION: Beartooth Pass, MT, WY DIFFICULTY LEVEL: extreme SUITABLE FOR: adults SEASON: late spring, early summer WILDLIFE: grizzly bear, gray wolf, mountain goat, mountain bluebird, American clipper Many skilled backcountry skiers consider this adventure a rite of passage. Join others

who make skiing the Pass their annual pilgrimage in late spring or early summer for the ultimate skiing experience. Please remember to take appropriate safety measures for your adventure.

Horseback riding LOCATION: Sawtooth Wilderness, ID DIFFICULTY LEVEL: easy to moderate SUITABLE FOR: all ages SEASON: summer WILDLIFE: gray wolf, pika, elk, pronghorn, porcupine You can choose your own adventure with

Bike Teton Valley LOCATION: Driggs, ID DIFFICULTY LEVEL: easy to extreme SUITABLE FOR: all ages SEASON: all seasons (fat bikes best in winter) WILDLIFE: moose, mountain lion, sandhill crane, beaver, grizzly bear, black bear, elk, fox, marmot, wolf Why drive through the Teton Valley when

you can bike it? Each mountain range offers a unique mountain biking experience with stunning views. Take the groomed Nordic ski trails or the abandoned rail line trail that is 104 miles (167 km) on converted railway track.

Tips for recreating in wild country Part of recreating in regions with wildlife means being prepared. It's important for all of

us to know how to not only protect ourselves from a negative encounter with wildlife, but to protect animals from having to be moved or killed. Here are some helpful hints to safely recreate in wild country:

 Inquire about recent bear or wildlife activity in the area Carry bear spray and know how to use it properly

navigating and recreating safely in the backcountry.

Recreate with others Always let someone know where you are going and when you'll be back

Make your presence known by talking, singing or making loud noises. Animals, and in particular bears, are more likely to avoid people when their presence is known Keep children close and dogs on leash Observe and photograph animals from the safety of your car

Don't approach or feed wildlife; respect their space and move away Please ensure that you are always properly equipped and are making minimal impact on the environment. Be sure to know your limits, and have appropriate experience for
