YouthCO reduces the impact of HIV and Hep C on the youth of British Columbia through peer support, education and meaningful community engagement. We strive to foster inclusive communities where youth empower youth to make informed decision about their own well-being and works to end the stigma surrounding HIV and Hep C.

Position Description

The Yúusnewas Manager oversees the budget, activities, networks and staff of the program. **This position is open to self-identified Indigenous youth aged 16-29.**

Responsibilities

With the support of YouthCO's Executive Director, the Yúusnewas Program Manager will:

- Maintain community networks and partnerships
- Write grants, project proposals and follow-up with reporting
- Develop and oversee annual work plan
- Develop and maintain curriculum
- Project management
- Book workshops with rural First Nations communities, along with necessary travel and accommodation
- Oversee workshop bookings, outreach and tasks of educators in the program
- Give ongoing feedback to support growth of program staff
- Deliver yearly evaluations and learning goals of program staff
- Maintain, recruit and deliver volunteer meetings and opportunities
- Maintain Steering Committee

YouthCO operates on the traditional territory of the xʷməθkʷəyəm, Sḵwxwú7mesh and Tsleil-Waututh peoples, and works to support indigenous youth leadership, health and wellbeing.
